





Amy's Top Tips... for filming yourself at home during Lockdown.

Top Tip 1.

Ensure your lens is clean to avoid marks on your video.



Top Tip 2.

Put your phone in Landscape mode.

That's on its side, like this.

Part 2 of Amy's Top Tips for filming:

Top Tip 3.

Put your phone in aeroplane mode so you don't get interrupted.



Top Tip 4.

Record in a location where there is as much light as possible.

Make the most of natural lighting. If there's a window, use the light coming through it to show the detail on your subject. Use lamps if the room is dark.



Top Tip No. 5

Keep your camera/ phone steady!

Use both hands and lock your elbows into your sides. You could rest your camera/ phone on a hard surface e.g. books, window sill or nearest plant pot!

Part 3 of Amy's Top Tips for filming:

Top Tip 6.

Choose your location carefully. Make sure the viewer can tell which room you are filming in. So if you're in the kitchen, be sure to get shots of your oven and fridge, for example. In the bedroom, get shots of the bed and wardrobe.



Top Tip 7.

Make sure we can see your face and do your best not to look into the camera.


